
Prepared Microscope slides for Christmas?



Of course this is always a warning sign, but I dared and bought one of their 100 slide boxes for \$54. They come in a nice wooden box and are well labeled. I would say that about 75% of the slides are acceptable and the rest are still better than some of the junk you get when buying a toy microscope. In my estimation they are worth the money.


The following pictures are samples from one of these boxes:




Rabbit Lymph node
